

# The History of the HOBO CLASSIC


In 2000, Dan and Marilyn Milton, Cris Jennings, Sherry Johnston, Greg and EstherSue Sykes, and Doug and Darlene Meyers purchased the Firecracker Sale and turned it into a non-profit organization to benefit the llama industry. The Miltons traveled to Estes Park Wool Market & Llama Show, the Ag Show in California and OFFF in Oregon with extensive displays to promote all aspects of the llama industry. Dan and Marilyn gave seminars all over the country and hosted two major llama auctions combined with shows in Roseberg, Oregon. They turned all profits back into the industry by educating, sponsoring events, awarding scholarships and even supporting organizations such as LANA with a \$5.000 donation to sustain them

As sales on the West Coast were declining, the group needed another way of making money. Because shows were still popular, they decided a new show was the way to go. All desirable dates for a show were already booked so the Miltons conceived the idea of a show that could be held in the winter time and the Hobo Classic was born. Grooming became "illegal" and to enforce that, there were Hobo cops and a jail. It grew from there to include an entire Hobo town complete with a junk yard, a soup kitchen, a dock, box car, outhouses (all decorated with authentic Hobo symbols) and a perpetual yard sale where those who didn't have costumes could get themselves

in the spirit of things. For the first several years, there were over 300 llamas in attendance at the shows. There were many special events for all levels of performance with awards and cash prizes. The group sponsored sportsmanship and service awards, as well.

In 2008, the Miltons purchased the Celebrity Show, and they passed the Hobo Classic to LANA. The Stanislaus County Fairgrounds, in Turlock, California, was the home to the 2009 Hobo Show. For many years, Chene and Andrea Mogler and their family brought the spirit of the show back to its true Hobo roots, arresting and jailing the "criminals" who were caught grooming at the show. After several years, Kathy Nichols became superintendent. She and some dedicated volunteers work to make the Hobo Classic Show and festivities a fun weekend for everyone. In 2022, the show moved to the Merced County Fairgrounds which better fit LANA's needs. The participants enjoy the ambience of the Hobo village — a fun gathering place where LANA's annual membership meeting, Annual Awards presentation, morning hospitality, dinner, and auctions take place.

For those of you who joined us, we thank you for coming. If you were unable to make it to the show, we hope to see you next year as we continue the tradition of the Hobo Classic Show.


## Show Secretary, Scorekeeper & Awards By Joy Pedroni

Sunday morning, we arrived early and, along with Kaycee Lusk, had all the obstacles moved out of the arena to make way for the halter classes. The cheerful help and experienced course designs by Kathy made the performance classes a breeze.

The Hobo Show has been the venue for LANA's Annual Membership Meeting for a long time. And in keeping with that tradition, after the performance classes were completed and the auction tables were closed, Stephanie Pedroni, the Vice President conducted the 2025 meeting. The agenda included a welcome from Stephanie followed by introductions of each of the Board members: Lee Beringsmith (director who was absent), Margaret Drew (director) Emily Muirhead (director), Kathy Nichols (President and Newsletter Editor who was absent), Joy Pedroni (Treasurer, Office Manager, and Webmaster), Stephanie Pedroni (Vice President), Susan Rich (Secretary), Cali Roberson (Director) and Cathy Spalding (non-voting Advisory Chair who was absent). LANA thanked Susan Rich and Layla Cordero for sponsoring the show.

#### The Fun Awards announcement followed:

- ◆ Patti Oxenham was awarded the Best Hobo Costume for Saturday, and appreciative comments were made about her shopping cart rounds, sometimes with adult beverages available, sometimes with chips. This feature of her costume was the clincher for the award.
- ◆ Patti also received the award for having driven the longest distance to participate in the Hobo Show. She and her granddaughter traveled 308 miles each way to attend.
- ◆ Mario Rivera accepted the award on behalf of Lisa Labendeira for the most entries.
- ◆ Cali Roberson won the first to register, after some discussion that the award giver could not award herself the prize. So, truth be told, she was the second to register.

The fiscal health of LANA served as the topic of discussion for the next agenda item. Treasurer Joy Pedroni shared the end-of-year balances for both General Fund (\$14,289.49) and the Lifeline account (\$8,858.53). The longest portion of the report centered around the successful reinvestment of what had been the funds deposited with the Morris Animal Foundation (MAF). These reinvested funds have been placed in an interest bearing account, and since their placement have accrued over \$6,000. Originally intended to support camelid research, these funds will now be more broadly used, along with funds reserved for research, to support the camelid community. The proposals focused on camelids have just not been forthcoming from researchers, and the MAF requested that they be able return the funds.

Susan Rich awarded the three winning youth their awards for the Youth Essay and Art Contest from November 1st, 2024.

Dr. Michelle Kutzler was awarded the Hummdinger Award for all her work on behalf of camelids. The Youth Follow Me Award went to Kaycee Lusk for her consistently positive attitude at shows, her willingness to jump in and help without being asked, and her sportsmanship and calm decorum. Lastly, and as a surprise, Stephanie Pedroni received the Adult Follow Me Award for all her work on behalf of Ilamas, alpacas and LANA.

Cali Roberson reported on the upcoming LANA events, some of which have dates already and some of which are To Be Announced.

The comedic Sheriff's report followed with several arrests and the posting of bail by sympathetic family members and friends. Sheriff Mario Rivera, aided by his two deputies: Kaycee Lusk and Audrey Roberson, provided great entertainment as they read off the tickets, arrested the culprits with pink, fuzzy handcuffs, and orchestrated the bidding for bail.

Lastly, Stephanie Pedroni officially closed the meeting at 7 PM. A lively dessert auction led by Patti Oxenham capped the evening.

## The Auctions By Susan Rich

The Auctions were a success this year! Thank you to the many contributors to the tables and to the buyers for their generous bids. Thirteen donors supplied the 12 tables with items up for auction, and 20 buyers participated. As the show was relatively small this year, we had fewer donors and fewer buyers. But the youth were exceptionally active and headed home with many new treasures. Their bids totaled \$328! The LANA Lama Lifeline tables brought in \$359 for their coffers. # Minimum Standards of Care for Llamas and Alpacas

Minimum Standards of Care are mandatory to llama and alpaca survival and humane treatment. These are the most basic requirements that all llamas and alpacas must have for physical well-being and, as such, define minimum requirements for animal control officers and government officials investigating questionable llama and alpaca care situations.

- 1. **WATER**: Animals should have continuous access to potable drinking water.
- 2. **NUTRITIONAL**: Animals should have nourishment adequate to sustain life and health.
- 3. **SHELTER**: Animals should have natural or man-made shelter that enables them to find relief from extreme weather conditions. The sheltered area must allow for the ability to stand, lie down, rest and reasonably move about.
- 4. **MOBILITY**: Animals should have a living area through which they can move freely and exercise independently
- 5. **NEGLECT**: Animals should have a physical appearance free from signs of serious neglect. Signs of serious neglect may include such things as crippled ambulation due to severely curled toenails, ingrown halters, or living conditions not meeting the minimums listed above.
- 6. **SAFETY**: Animals should be reasonably safeguarded from injury or death within their defined living environment and/or when traveling.
- 7. **CRUELTY**: Animals should be reasonably safeguarded from cruel treatment and actions that endanger life or health or cause avoidable suffering.
- 8. **SOCIALIZING**: Llamas and alpacas are herd animals and should not live alone without a companion animal. A cria (a baby llama or alpaca under six months) should not be removed or apart from other llamas or alpacas.

# LANA's Emergency Wallet Card Next of Kin Card & Live Animal Alert

In 1996, LAMA Lifeline was created. It was apparent that rescue was but one role Lifeline needed to include in their new program. Although Lifeline consciously structured itself to respond to llama needs, Lifeline volunteers encountered llama rescue situations where other animals (i.e.: goats, sheep, cats, pics, and geese) came into play. To the owner needing Lifeline's assistance, these animals' welfare was every bit as important as the llamas. Lifeline learned early on, when one type of animal on a ranch is jeopardized by a ranch emergency, all the animals may all be at risk.

Many of the llama rescue situations Lifeline has been involved with began with some sort of human emergency. Having a plan in place for llama/other animal care in case of emergency allowed owner input and control during the chaos of crisis. Real life crisis, health emergencies and death do happen to people all of the time. Individuals prepare for these events by making wills/living trusts, medical powers of attorney, and dutifully paying insurance premiums; some even insure their llamas. Lifeline realized there was generally nothing in place to

ensure basic everyday needs were met (food, water and animal care) if the owners were suddenly out of the picture and unable to provide or direct ranch coverage during an emergency situation. In response to this need in the llama community, LANA developed an emergency notification card that links Next of Kin contacts with animal care contacts.

The hard facts of life are that no one can predict when a tragedy may strike and human crisis can generate significant chaos to create animal emergencies. Thoughtful preplanning can prevent putting animals at risk and avoid compounding an already difficult situation. The NOK/Live Animal Alert Card is but one practical application of LANA's commitment to the community, the well being of Ilamas and Lifeline's consulting, networking, education philosophy.

LANA was contacted in December 2024, and asked if LANA still had the NOK cards available. The Board of Directors agreed to create an updated card and make it available to anyone. Please feel free to print this and share with others.
